

The above card was sent by Gilbert Beaupre to his father in Grand Isle, Maine. Seems like just a good old post card if one likes trains but the note back to his father written Oct 14, 1937 says: "Hello Dear father and mother: Hit Boston, swellest ride I ever took without Pullman. These new cars are a piff. Had sandwiches mother give me for breakfast. I rode on from Bangor in same train as Jack Dempsey. I saw him twice on street and station. I saw gangster's killing in Bangor. Now-7:40 AM. Leaving for Addi's place. Never worry. Love Gilbert."

Gilbert was referring to the Oct 12, 1937 killing of Public Enemy #1. Al Brady and his gang were killed by FBI Agents in a gunfight on Central Street in downtown Bangor. Jack Dempsey may have been on his way home from one his visits to a northern Maine sporting camp.


UNION RIVER STAMP CLUB




James Archibald Practical Phrenologist <u>Monticello, Maine</u>

Archibald was a town official for Monticello as well as Littleton. His son, Bernard, was an attorney in Houlton.

His grandson, James P. Archibald was a judge in Houlton and became a Maine Supreme Court Justice.

On May 7, 2009, in Los Angeles, California, the Postal ServiceTM will issue a 44-cent *The Simpsons* stamp, in five designs in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) convertible, booklet of 20 stamps (Item 679000). Designed by Matt Groening, a native of Portland, Oregon, the stamps go on sale nationwide May 7, 2009. With these stamps, the U.S. Postal Service® recognizes *The Simpsons*, the longest running comedy in the history of American prime-time television, entering its 20th year, as a regularly scheduled half-hour series in 2009.



















What was interesting was that his postal card was addressed and written in the same handwriting and ink, but the cancel was a different VT town, and the return address and name was different. A mystery.

TIM, MAINE

This postcard is a favorite of George Bostwick. The picture postcard shows a scene of a rustic cabin with trees. TIM, MAINE was an office open only in the summer located in Franklin County. George's first father-in-law, who was born and raised in Wilton (also in Franklin County) used to take a couple of weeks off every spring to rent a cabin and go fishing in Tim Pond. The card was sent to a women in Stratton and was received there the next day according to the receiving cancel. Information in the Rarity Guide to the Post Offices of Maine indicates that this office was open from 02-Jun-1898 to 15-Apr-1935.
