
UNION RIVER STAMP CLUB

Houlton, Maine POW Camp

As World War II waged a young German soldier was stationed at Normandy on D Day in 1944. Over taken by the Allied Forces Gerhard Kleindt was captured by the Canadian Services. As a Prisoner of War, Kleindt was transported to the Houlton, Maine POW Camp located at the Houlton Army Air Base. This base had been set up before the United States had entered into the war to facilitate ferrying aircraft across the border into Canada.

As many men and women from Aroostook County had either enlisted or traveled to Connecticut to work in the factories to support the War effort there was a severe shortage of labor to help cut timber and to plant and harvest the potato crops. As soon as the POW's were transported to Houlton they were given duties to help fill this workforce shortage.





Working in the fields and woods the POW's were "paid" \$1.00 a day . They were issued script to be exchanged at the PX for candy, gum, cigarettes and beer.



The POW's would report to the Red Cross in Washington, D.C. on a regular basis.
Here is an envelope from the Campspokesman or Lagersprecher .



The POW's were given post cards and letter sheets and were allowed to send messages back to Germany. The mail was of course censored and treated to make sure no "invisible" ink had been used to send home secrets.


